OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

SIGI, in partnership with Alianza por Solidaridad (Aps) aim to economically, socially and legally empower women and girls to ensure that they participate in inclusive, safe, and just communities through three outcomes.

I. Skilled women employed in decent jobs and enabled women in control to run their own businesses

SIGI aims to build the capacities of 200 Syrian and Jordanian marginalized women through vocational trainings as a first step for potential employment based on identified available jobs in partnership with the private sector; as well as build the capacities of 80 women on developing business plans – 15 of whom will receive grants to implement their own businesses. An Employment Unit will also

be created at SIGI office in Amman to provide social legal and professional consultations to targeted women, in addition to the provision of awareness sessions and recommendations to private businesses on decent work.

II. Women rights promoted & enforced in the legal frameworks

This project also aims on promoting women's rights and legislative amendments to labour-related laws in order to economically empower women and ensure protection of rights. SIGI will hold roundtable discussions on specific legislative acts with decision makers and a number of ministries including the Ministry of Labour, Ministry of Industry and Trade, Ministry of Social Development and the Ministry of Ministry of Planning and International Cooperation among others. Partners will also hold a national conference on national and international legal protection mechanism to combat GBV and SGBV and conduct a nationwide media campaign targeting 3000 individuals.

III. Women have access to quality GBV and SGBV services

APS will lead partner CBOs to conduct a GBV response service map assessment in Mafraq, Irbid, Zarqa and Amman to provide an accurate and comprehensive picture of services offered, as well as identify service linkages gaps. Furthermore, following capacity assessments and detailed evaluations, 8 CBOs will be chosen for technical and equipment support in order to enhance their capacities on providing GBV response services. CBO trainings will include approach to case management, interviewing and communication skills, SOPs, case management of women and girls living with disabilities at risk of or survived violence, among others. CBOs will then conduct awareness sessions with community members and beneficiaries on GBV causes, consequences, protection risks, and women's rights.
